Join Utopia Tours on this 12-day round trip air tour to Alaska - the Last Frontier! Fly into Juneau, Alaska. During our time in Alaska, see much of the unspoiled wilderness as we travel seeing majestic mountains, wildlife such as bear, moose, and caribou,

plus pristine waters and much more. Routing from Juneau through Skagway, Whitehorse, Tok, Fairbanks, Denali, and concluding our Alaskan adventure with a 2-night stay in Anchorage before we fly home.

<u>Tues., July 21:</u> Juneau, AK IMAGINE ALASKA! Mt Denali, wild rivers, big fish, glaciers, and the gold rush! It's all here...in Alaska! Join Utopia Tours as we begin our Alaska Tour today. We will travel to <u>Minneapolis</u> and board our flight <u>to Juneau, AK</u>. Upon arrival this evening we will be transferred to our hotel for a <u>3-night</u> stay in Alaska's capitol city, that can only be reached by water or air. Our lodging is at the <u>Baranof Hotel</u>, which is within walking distance to shops and restaurants in Juneau.

<u>Wed., July 22:</u> Juneau, AK (B, D) The morning is yours to enjoy on your own, in <u>Juneau</u>. Later we'll stop at the <u>Salmon Hatchery</u>. Here you will learn about salmon hatching, the commercial fishing industry, and marine environments. Plus watch the salmon swim up a 450-foot fish ladder. A <u>local guide</u> will join us as we <u>sightsee around Juneau</u> today, plus visit the <u>Mendenhall Glacier</u>, an impressive river of blue ice about 12 miles long, plus see the Governor's Palace and more. Plus have some free time to explore the downtown area shops, etc. Then return to our lodging. A delicious <u>meal</u> is included tonight. Enjoy your evening here in <u>Juneau</u>, which lies along the beautiful Gastineau Channel at the foot of snowcapped Mount Roberts and Juneau.

Thurs., July 23: Juneau, AK (B)

You have the option of going up the Mount Roberts Tramway for a spectacular view of the area. You also have the option of going on a whale watching adventure cruise this afternoon where they guarantee you will see whales! Or, instead of whale watching, you have the option to go salmon or halibut fishing. We will line up a fishing company that will take those interested on either a half day or a full day of fishing. With the fish you catch, the company will freeze and wrap them, and set a date to have the fish sent to your home. (Today's options are not included in price of tour. We will contact you closer to departure with fishing and whale watching info.) Your tour director will help with the different options while in Juneau. The evening is yours to enjoy on your own.

<u>Fri., July 24:</u> Skagway, AK (B) This morning we will board the <u>Alaska Marine Highway Ferry</u> that will take us <u>from Juneau and follow the Lynn Canal to Skagway</u>. You will see many glaciers and maybe eagles on this cruise which is about 6 hours, and stops at the <u>port in Haines, AK</u>. We will arrive in **Skagway** early afternoon and then check into our hotel for the night. Skagway retains the romance and excitement of yesteryear with its 1890's look and atmosphere, and was the Gateway to the Klondike gold fields. Free evening here in Skagway.

<u>Sat., July 25:</u> Whitehorse, YT (B, L) We will feel like prospectors today as we board the <u>White Pass & Yukon Railroad</u> this morning and travel up the <u>White Pass</u> seeing where gold seekers hiked to cross over the pass and then on to try to reach the gold fields of the Yukon. A <u>box lunch</u> is included while on the train as we travel from <u>Skagway to Fraser</u>. In Fraser, we've crossed the border into the Yukon Territory. Here we reboard our motorcoach and enjoy the scenic drive to <u>Whitehorse, YT.</u> We will make stops at Carcross and Emerald Lake on our way. Tonight is on your own here in Whitehorse.

<u>Sun., July 26:</u> Tok, AK (B) Leaving Whitehorse, we will travel the <u>Alaska Highway</u> today, making scenic picture stops at Kluane Lake, the largest lake in the Yukon Territory. After Beaver Creek, YT, we will cross back into Alaska, and make our way to <u>Tok, AK</u>, making scenic and meal stops along the way. Tok is known as the dog-sledding capital of Alaska, and is a trade center for nearby Athabascan villages. Some say Tok is a native word meaning "peace crossing." It will be a free evening here in <u>Tok, AK</u>.

Mon., July 27: Fairbanks, AK (B, D) On our way to Fairbanks we will stop at Delta Junction and see the sign marking the end of the Alaska Highway. We view the Alaskan Mountain Range along the way. Prior to our arrival in Fairbanks we will stop in North Pole, AK, at the Santa Claus House, for some early Christmas shopping. Then venture in to gold mining history when we hop aboard a replica of the Tanana Valley Railroad for a short narrated ride near the original rail routes taking us to Gold Dredge #8. They will demonstrate gold mining plus you will get to pan for gold and bring home some of that gold dust or nuggets! Plus, while here we'll see the Trans-Alaska Oil <u>Pipeline</u> and will learn how it was built to transport crude oil from Prudhoe Bay to Valdez. This evening we will go to Pioneer Park, Alaska's only historic theme park, to enjoy an included delicious Salmon Bake of salmon, cod and prime rib as we sit outside in a rustic setting. Just a short walk from the salmon bake is the Palace Theatre. Here we will see "The Number One Show Throughout Alaska and Canada", the Palace Theatre's GOLDEN HEART REVIEW is a hilarious musical comedy that will leave you laughing, and a bit wiser about life in the last frontier. Through songs and stories, our polished, professional cast gives you the historical highlights of Fairbanks, also known as "The Golden Heart City", and answers a few commonly asked questions about our town...such as why would anyone want to live here? Our evening will be spent in Fairbanks, AK. Fairbanks is near the geographical center of Alaska and is in the Alaskan Interior region.

<u>Tues., July 28:</u> Denali National Park (B) This morning we'll join Captain Binkley's family as we board the <u>Riverboat Discovery</u> for an unforgettable <u>cruise aboard an authentic sternwheeler</u>. During this <u>narrated cruise</u> we'll step ashore at the <u>Old Chena Indian Village</u>, experience a traditional <u>Athabascan fish camp</u>, and stop at <u>Susan Butcher's Dog Sled Camp</u>. A beautiful drive this afternoon stopping in <u>Nenana</u> before continuing to <u>Denali National Park</u>. We will spend <u>2 nights</u> here in a resort setting. This evening is free or you may wish to take in the Cabin Nite Show (Option)

<u>Wed., July 29:</u> Denali National Park (B, L) Denali means "the Great One" and is the second largest of our national parks. <u>Mt Denali</u> (Mount McKinley), which sits here in the horizon, is the highest point in North America at 20,320 feet. Today we will take a <u>wildlife tour</u> deep into the wilderness with a <u>box lunch included</u>. We will watch for moose, bear, doll sheep and more plus look for a beautiful view of <u>Mt Denali</u>. We'll spend a second night in the **Denali Park area.**

Thurs., July 30: Anchorage, AK (B, D) Departing Denali this morning we board the McKinley Domed Rail taking us from Denali through beautiful scenery of Alaska, possibly seeing moose or bear out our windows. The narration along the way, and meal options (on your own) will make this an enjoyable ride to Talkeetna. Here we will reboard our coach and travel to Wasilla, AK, to visit the Iditarod Trail Headquarters and learn of the annual Anchorage to Nome Dog Sled Race. Our destination is Anchorage, Alaska's largest city, bordered on the east by the beautiful Chugach Mountain Range, on the west by the Knik Arm of Cook Inlet. We will be sightseeing around Anchorage seeing Lake Hood Seaplane Base and more, before having our included farewell meal this evening. We will spend two nights here in Anchorage, AK.

<u>Fri., July 31:</u> Anchorage, AK (B, L) We travel from Anchorage along the <u>Seward Highway</u> to <u>Milepost 48</u> and through <u>Anton Anderson Memorial Tunnel</u> to <u>Whittier, AK</u>. From Whittier we start a <u>5-hour Wilderness Explorer</u>

<u>Cruise along the Prince William Sound</u>. <u>Lunch is included</u> as we relax and marvel in our surroundings full of history, wildlife, and beauty of the waters, seeing many glaciers, and more. Marine animals and birds flourish in these areas. Our last evening of the tour will again be spent here in <u>Anchorage, AK</u>. There are many fine restaurants in Anchorage to enjoy an evening meal at tonight. Plus you can shop for an Ulu, or some Alaska wear.



<u>Sat., Aug. 1:</u> Home Today we depart from the Ted Stevens International Airport in <u>Anchorage</u>, on our <u>flight to Minneapolis</u>, which arrives in Minneapolis later this evening.
